Paper Iris

PAPER CRAFT PATTERN INCLUDES:

Instructions and pattern pieces to create your own PAPER IRIS.



Get creative with this simple decorative paper flower design.

Materials List:

- 2 pieces of 5" x 5" scrapbooking paper in coordinating patterns/colors (We used paper from Amy's Belle Paper Pad by K&Company - Product # 626263 and the Sola Paper Pad - Product # 626270.)
- 1 Decorative Brad (We used Amy's Fabric Brads by K&Company - Product # 558366.)

Tools Needed:

- Craft Knife or Scissors
- Pencil
- Cutting Mat
- Awl (Or the sharp point of a craft knife)

Finished Size:

3 1/4" x 4"

Step 1.

CUT THE PIECES OUT OF YOUR PAPER

A. Trace your pattern pieces onto the scrapbooking paper as follows:

Paper #1:
-Trace 1 of Piece A

Paper #2:
-Trace 1 of Piece B
-Trace 1 of Piece A

B. On your cutting mat, use your craft knife to carefully cut out each piece. (You can use scissors if you are more comfortable, but the craft knife will give you a cleaner cut in the small areas.)

Step 2.

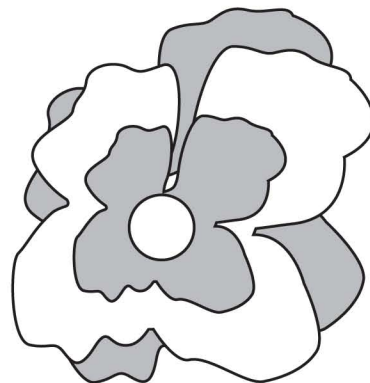
MAKING THE PAPER IRIS

A. Poke a small hole using an awl through both Piece A's and Piece B at the small "X". Layer the three pieces, lining up the small holes.

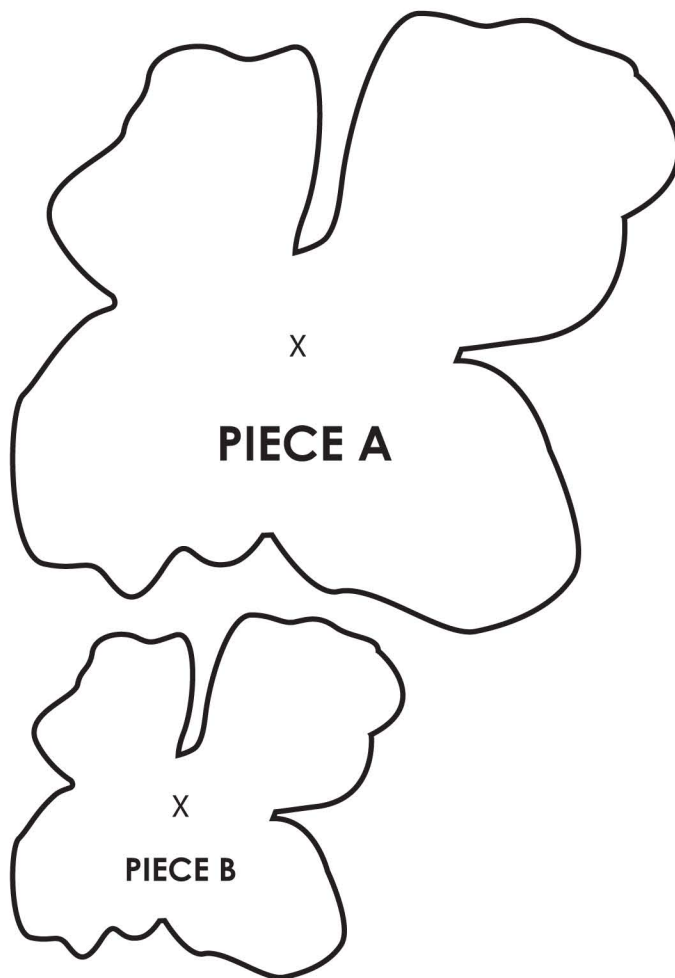
B. Insert a decorative brad into the holes through all the layers and secure it on the back.

C. Slightly curl up the edges of each layer by rolling them around your pencil.

Your Paper Iris is complete! You may choose to make a stem for your Iris. We made our stems out of plastic zip ties.
